The Armonk Baseball League (ABL) is a not-for-profit community based organization that provides baseball programs for children ages 5 through 16. ABL has served as the Little League chartered baseball organization for the town of North Castle for more than 50 years. Little League was founded in Williamsport, PA., in 1939. It is the largest organized youth sports program in the world and its goals are to assist youth in developing qualities of citizenship, discipline, teamwork and physical well being, through proper guidance and exemplary leadership.

ABL is a strictly voluntary effort and serves over 600 North Castle children and their families each year, by providing a diverse program that gives kids of all skill levels the opportunity to learn, play and enjoy America's national past time. Dedicated adults from the community donate their time, energy, expertise, and often personal funds to create an exceptional program which strives to help give our children the tools to become successful young adults, while engendering a true love of the game. In order to make our programs accessible to all children ABL raises funds to provide scholarship and equipment to families in need, while also utilizing donations to help improve and maintain our fields. The Miracle League of Westchester County's mission is to establish and sustain baseball programs for people (of all ages) with disabilities. Our objective is to provide an opportunity for those individuals to experience the joy and benefits that come from playing our national pastime.

Our aims are to help the league's players develop social skills and increase self esteem, while promoting community support and sponsorship for the league. We believe that everyone deserves a chance to play baseball.

The Miracle League of Westchester is one of 149 Miracle Leagues around the country. In 1998 after watching a seven-year-old boy come to every practice game and cheer on his younger brother from his wheelchair, Coach Eddie Bagwell invited the child to join his team and participate in their baseball game and so the Miracle league was born. It began with a handful of children and has now grown to a national non-profit organization that serves hundreds of disabled children and their families, while providing volunteer opportunities for adults and local children who serve as buddies for their disabled peers.

The Westchester chapter of the Miracle League is the brain child of Steve Madey and is unique. The Miracle League field in Hartsdale, specially designed with rubberized turf to accommodate the needs of the league's special players, is the first Miracle field to be built in New York State, and the first field of its kind ever to be funded by a county government. **For more information visit us at www.mlwny.org**
